





DIY RAINMAKER

YOU WILL NEED THESE SUPPLIES

- A pringles can or similarly shaped snack food tube
- Two handfuls of rice*
- A large balloon

- Strong cellotape
- A few sheets of paper
- Scissors
- Decoration supplies

STEP 1

Add the rice (or other noise maker of choice) to your can.

STEP 2

Scrunch up some paper lengthways to create sausage shapes and put these inside the can.

STEP 3

If you still have the lid, place it on the top of your can and secure it with tape.


If you do not have your lid, you can use a balloon. To do this, stretch out a balloon a few times before cutting off the neck. Tightly stretch the balloon over the tube's mouth and secure with tape.

STEP 4

Make sure the lid is secure, then shake and flip the can to listen to the rice moving inside. If you can't hear it, try adding more rice or adjusting the paper to let it flow more easily.

STEP 5

Now to decorate! Choose your colours and start painting. You may need more than one coat to cover the outside.



^{*}Use small hard objects like dried pulses, peppercorns, beads, or gravel to create the sound of rain. Experiment with different sizes and weights to hear new sounds!
